DALLAS, TX - Congresswoman Eddie Bernice Johnson (D-Dallas) has endorsed State Representative Eric Johnson (D-Dallas) for re-election to the Texas House of Representatives in District 100. Congresswoman Johnson has also nominated Representative Johnson for inclusion in the prestigious American Council of Young Political Leaders (ACYPL).
